## Parking

There are two parking lots at Evergreen (front and rear of the building). You can access the parking lots by travelling north on Pinetree Way and entering on the right after the intersection at Guildford Way.

## Paid Parking

- The Centre's parking lots are owned and operated by the City of Coquitlam.
- Paid parking is in effect Monday to Saturday, 8am 6pm.
- The fee is \$1.00/hour.
- You can pay using the <u>Flowbird</u> app.

## **Additional Parking**

There is an additional City parking lot located at the south-east corner of Pinetree and Guildford, across the street from the Centre's electronic sign. Paid parking is in effect, and parking is free after 6pm.

### Accessible Parking Spaces

- Three accessible parking spaces are located right in front of the building with access to the ramp.
- There is no dedicated accessible parking at the back of the building.
- If you require designated parking or require assistance with parking and entering the building, please contact Merideth at <u>operations@artsbc.org</u> for questions and to coordinate assistance.

## **Venue Accessibility**

**Green lines** are completely flat walkways around the exterior of the building. There are no random steps up or down inside or outside the building.

**Orange lines** are ramp access. These have recently been assessed by Elections Canada and meet the correct grade for wheelchair accessibility.

The Conference will be held in the three rooms shaded in red: The Main Stage Theatre, Studio B and Studio A.

**Note**\* Studio A & B are from inside the building during hours that the Gallery is open (12noon-5:00pm). Outside of those hours Studio A & B are accessible from outside and the doors facing the main parking lot.



### Elevators

• The **lobby elevator** (indicated by the purple E at the left of the diagram) is a standard building elevator (52"x80" with a 42" door opening) that **provides access to the upper and lower lobbies** and their attached spaces such as the backstage areas.

### **Entrance Doors**

There are two automated doors to the building, one located in the main lobby, and the other located in the art gallery.

### Washrooms

- There are gendered washrooms in the main lobby area.
- There is a single universal washroom in the lower lobby and a single universal washroom in the corridor between Studio A and B.

### For Blind and Partially Sighted Folks

### Moving, Stimming, Making Noise

As part of our introductory notes during the conference, we will remind everyone in attendance that you are free to move around, use the washroom, leave and come back at any time.

In addition, this is a space where we want to create safety for folks who experience involuntary movement and noise making. **Our staff and volunteers will not ask you to stay quiet or still. We will ask that attendees do not ask that of anyone either.** 

## **Masking and Illness**

Many folks are immunocompromised or in contact with those who are. We strongly recommend that delegates wear masks at the Conference when not eating or drinking.

We will have hand sanitizer available around the venue.

With three days of programming and many people in attendance, the risk of contracting Covid and other respiratory illnesses at the Conference is higher than other activities.
